1. Summary of the primary business

a. *Business Overview - Products and services offered by our Company*

We operate a vertically integrated, multi-asset class stock exchange offering a single platform for trading, clearing and listing, and other services such as data feed, data terminal and licensing services, across cash market, futures, options, mutual funds platform, commodity derivatives, exchange-traded currency derivatives, wholesale debt market and interest rate futures, among others. Our operations are supported by our proprietary technology infrastructure that is resilient and secure, supporting high-speed and high-frequency transactions while ensuring seamless market operations, comprehensive market data dissemination, and allows for rapid implementation of regulatory directives.

b. *Industries served and typical customers or clients of our Company*

We operate in India's securities exchange and capital markets infrastructure industry. Our customers include companies offering listing securities; trading members (proprietary, corporate, institutional and retail investors); members availing colocation, connectivity and clearing services; and index, data feed and terminal customers.

c. *Segment reporting and revenue contribution*

We have three reporting segments — Trading Services, Clearing Services and Others — with revenue by segment set out below:

Our operations are primarily in India. We have established NSE IFSC Limited, a subsidiary, in GIFT City, to enable Indian and foreign entities to trade in foreign currency-denominated securities and financial products, and access international financial markets, allowing trading for ~21 hours a day.

e. Revenue concentration among top 5 customers

Our top 5 trading members contributed 31.06%, 30.46%, 31.92%, 31.92% and 35.32% of our revenue from operations in the three months period ended June 30, 2026 and June 30, 2025, and in Fiscals 2026, 2025 and 2024, respectively. 2. Summary of the industry (Source: Redseer Report)

India is the fastest-growing G20 economy and is projected to become the world's third largest by Fiscal 2032P, with nominal gross domestic product (“**GDP**”) having grown from US\$0.47 trillion in Fiscal 2001 to US\$3.92 trillion in Fiscal 2026. Sustained economic expansion is expected to support continued growth in India's financial markets, driven by increasing household financialisation, formalisation of savings, an expanding investor base, regulatory strengthening and digital infrastructure development. The market capitalisation of entities listed on NSE has grown approximately 107 times over three decades, positioning India as the fourth largest equity market globally after the United States, China (including Hong Kong) and Japan as of June 30, 2026. Unique stock market investors in India exceeded 139 million as of March 2026, implying investor penetration of 13.45% of the adult population (aged 18+). Despite this growth, the market remains underpenetrated relative to peers: as of Fiscal 2026, India's market capitalisation to GDP ratio was 119.38%, compared to 224.04%, 199.20% and 171.60% for the US, Canada and Japan (CY2025), respectively, per World Bank data. Funds mobilised across equity, debt and business trusts rose from ₹5.83 trillion in Fiscal 2016 to ₹13.92 trillion in Fiscal 2026. In the three months period ended June 30 2026, fund mobilised stood at ₹3.04 trillion. Exchanges worldwide have transformed from narrow equity trading venues into diversified financial infrastructure providers. Indian exchanges, while technologically advanced and globally competitive in trading and clearing, remain concentrated in transaction and listing revenues, highlighting substantial scope for diversification.

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8. Risk Factors

The following are the top 10 internal risk factors as disclosed in the Red Herring Prospectus:

1. **Trading Volume Risk** – We earn revenue based on trades executed on our stock exchange, listing fees from Listed Entities, and fees from ancillary services such as Data Feed & Terminal services, data centre related services, and licensing services, and any significant decrease in the volume and value of such transactions could reduce demand for our products, constrain our growth and have a material adverse impact on our business, financial condition and results of operations.
2. **Revenue Concentration in Transaction Charges Risk** – In the three months period ended June 30, 2026 and 2025, and in Fiscals 2026, 2025 and 2024, we derived 79.44%, 78.20%, 78.65%, 79.55% and 82.07%, respectively of our revenue from operations from transaction charges, largely from our options and futures businesses; any failure to maintain or increase our trading volumes could have a material adverse impact on our business, financial condition and results of operations.
3. **Trading Member Concentration Risk** – We derived 47.00%, 45.60%, 46.78%, 44.48% and 45.26% of our revenue from operations from our top ten trading members in the three months period ended June 30, 2026 and 2025, and in Fiscals 2026, 2025 and 2024, respectively; any disruption in the services of these trading members or our inability to onboard new trading members could have a material adverse impact on our business, financial condition and results of operations.
4. **Regulatory Oversight and Inspection Risk** – We operate in a highly regulated industry, primarily overseen by SEBI. We are also subject to periodic inspections by SEBI and IFSCA and pursuant to such inspections, have received observations, show cause notices, and administrative warning, deficiency and advisory letters in relation to certain regulatory matters, and after issuance of show cause notices, enforcement actions including adjudication proceedings under Section 15-I and/or directions or penalties under Section 11B of the SEBI Act may be initiated by SEBI; any failure to comply could have a material adverse impact on our business, financial condition and results of operations.
5. **Enforcement and Adjudication Risk** – We have been, and continue to be, subject to enforcement actions, monetary penalties, adjudication proceedings, which may or may not get settled with SEBI in respect of alleged violations and regulatory matters with applicable SEBI regulations; the outcome of current and potential future proceedings is uncertain and could have a material adverse impact on our business, reputation, financial condition and results of operations.
6. **IT Infrastructure Reliability Risk** – Disruptions, failures or inadequacies in our IT infrastructure, systems or software, including those provided by third-party vendors, could adversely affect our business, reputation and results of operations, and may subject us to regulatory action or the imposition of financial disincentives by SEBI.
7. **New Listings and Capital Formation Dependence Risk** – Our ability to attract new listings, issuances and capital formation activities on our platforms is critical to our business, and any decline may adversely affect our operations.
8. **Cybersecurity Risk** – We are subject to cybersecurity risks, including a distributed denial of service attack we experienced in 2025, and any successful cyberattack could disrupt our operations and adversely affect our business, financial condition, results of operations, and prospects.
9. **Risk Management Systems Risk** – Our risk management systems may not always be adequate, which could result in financial losses, regulatory action and reputational harm.
10. **Clearing and Settlement Risk** – Our clearing corporation operations expose us to financial, operational, counterparty and systemic risks arising from our relationships with, and dependencies on, clearing members, depositories and other market infrastructure participants; any failure could have a material adverse impact on our business, financial condition and results of operations.
